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A GUIDE TO LISTENING TO CHAUSSON

The Concerto Op.21 for violin, piano and string quartet by Ernest Chausson is a highly visionary, suggestive and protean piece, and an important example of chamber music. The style falls within the romantic tradition, however, if one looks back at the great French composers such as Lully, Rameau or Couperin, the influence of their styles are clearly apparent. According to a noted musicologist, Ron Staff, the feature of Chausson's concerto is original and composite in a way that he defines as "spread between Franck's luxuriant variation of Wagnerian romanticism and Debussy's sensual impressionist language.

A balance is established in the dialogue between the instruments in which the overall harmony prevails, where the personalities of the solo violin and the piano are heard in concert with voice of the string quartet. Indeed, as Chausson himself said, the violin and piano are intended as " projections on a quartet background".

Chausson's quartet in C minor op.35 is another important example of chamber music. Numerous composers influenced Chausson in this piece. Chausson himself declared that it was "inspired" by Beethoven; a theme from Debussy's String Quartet is present in the first movement of the quartet; and a leitmotif that emerges from Wagner's the Rhinegold.

Chausson's use of dense pastel tones evokes Brahms. Chausson himself, however, is to be found in his unmistakeable, intense lyricism, in his elegance and capacity to transform the material. If the first movement of op. 35, Grave—Modéré, is a tortuous and enigmatic path among suffered expectations, intense melodies, songs of poetic beauty and enchanting idylls, the second movement is very peaceful until the Finale which is rhythmically lively and vigorously vital.

Biography

Gabriele Pieranunzi is one of the most representative italian violinist of his generation. He was awarded in the main International violin competitions including Premio Paganini (Genova), Tibor Varga (Sion), Ludwig Spohr (Freiburg) and he collaborated with great conductor such as J.Tate, G. Noseda, V.Fedoseyev. He has recently recorded the Kurt Weill Concerto op.12 for violin and wind orchestra with the winds of the Teatro San Carlo in Naples conducted by Jeffrey Tate for "Concerto Classics" label and the complete quartets for piano and strings by Mendelssohn for Decca — Universal.



JIN JU

Biography

Winner of the Gold Medal at the RNCM in Manchester, Jin Ju started her International carreer after she was laureated in Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow and Queen Elisabeth Competition in Brussels.

Her recordings with MDG label won an ECHO KLASSIK prize for "recording of the year" in Berlin in 2012, and a "GRAN PRIX DU DISQUE FREDERIC CHOPIN" in Warsaw 2015.

Jin Ju is currently piano professor at Imola International Piano Academy, Artist in Residence at Accademia Bartolomeo Cristofori in Florence, Guest Professor at Beijing Central Conservatory of Music in China.
